

Current Population Survey Civic Engagement and Volunteering Supplement 2023 Dataset Fact Sheet



The Current Population Survey Civic Engagement and Volunteering (CEV) Supplement is the most robust longitudinal survey about volunteerism and other forms of civic engagement in the United States. Produced in partnership with the U.S. Census Bureau, the CEV takes the pulse of our nation's civic health every two years. The data have various uses, such as supporting evidence-based decision making and efforts to understand how people make a difference in communities across the country.

What's in the dataset?

- Measures related to formally volunteering through organizations including frequency, hours served, and a new item about virtual volunteering.
- Measures of other types of participation in civic life such as informally helping neighbors, donating to charity, participating in organizations, and contacting public officials.
- Measures of how individuals perceive the relationship between their work and civic activities. ٠

What types of questions can CEV data answer?

- How do rates of civic engagement vary by geography and demographic characteristics?
- How has civic life in America changed over the past two decades? •
- How are different types of civic behaviors, such as formal volunteering and informal helping, interconnected?

Who might find CEV data useful?

- AmeriCorps partners looking to understand the landscape of civic participation in their state. •
- Policymakers who want to use data to inform strategies to encourage volunteerism, service, • and other forms of civic engagement.
- Researchers examining the drivers of civic health. •
