Frequently Asked Questions

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Below is a list of frequently asked questions (FAQs) for current Public Health AmeriCorps (PHA) Grantees interested in applying to the FY 2025 AmeriCorps State and National Notice Of Funding Opportunity. This is a supplementary document; please refer to the AmeriCorps State and National Notice of Funding Opportunity and associated instructions for detailed requirements.

Q1: Will projects considered under the PHA priority be subject to match and evaluation requirements?

Yes. All proposed projects under the FY 2025 AmeriCorps State and National Notice of Funding Opportunity are subject to all requirements within, including match and evaluation requirements.

*For the purposes of determining match and evaluation requirements, current PHA projects can be considered first year grantees under this Notice of Funding Opportunity. Please note, to be considered new, **current PHA grantees must apply as a new project using a new project ID.** Please contact the Portfolio Manager of your current PHA grant and request a new project be created for your organization.*

Please note: Grantees that apply with their current PHA grant number, or under a previous AmeriCorps State and National (ASN) project, will NOT be considered new and will be subject to match requirements in accordance with the number of years associated with that project.

Q2: If I am a current ASN competitive grantee and I also have a current PHA project, can I include my PHA project in my ASN FY 2025 continuation application?

PHA grantees who are also ASN competitive grantees may choose to include their PHA activities in their ASN continuation application. However, if a grantee chooses to do this, they will be subject to the match requirements associated with their ASN continuation award. Please note that for ASN continuations, expansions are subject to approval.

Q3: If I previously applied to Public Health AmeriCorps as a National Direct serving in only one state, can I do the same for this opportunity?

No. Per the [FY 2025 AmeriCorps State and National Notice of Funding Opportunity](#), page 9, “Organizations that plan to operate in only one state must apply through the state or territory commissions. Each Commission has its own state-based selection process and submits applications to compete for funding directly to AmeriCorps. The list of Commissions can be found on the AmeriCorps State Service Commissions' webpage.”
