



Public Health AmeriCorps Overview

Partnership with Centers for Disease Control (CDC)

Goals:

- Help meet public health needs of local communities by providing needed capacity and support in state and local public health settings and advancing more equitable health outcomes for communities who are currently or historically underserved.
- Provide pathways to good, quality public health-related careers by providing exposure through onsite experience, training, and more, with a focus on recruiting AmeriCorps members who reflect the communities in which they will serve.











Continuation Only

Debt Ceiling Deal impacts to Public Health AmeriCorps funding are being determined.

FY 24 "Continuation Only" process:

- non-competitive process FY 23 PHA grantees already underwent a competitive process.
- unique continuation process if funding is insufficient to cover all continuation requests.
- Not expecting to fulfill expansion requests.
- seeking to make grantees whole up to FY 23 budgets, taking into account unexpended funding.

New public health partners should explore other AmeriCorps funding, (including <u>AmeriCorps State and National</u> and <u>Grants.gov</u>.




Eligibility



- Only current Public Health AmeriCorps grantees, also known as PHA continuation applicants, are eligible.
- This includes organizations that have current Public Health AmeriCorps awards that will be in program Year 2 or 3 in FY 2024.







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Type of Award



- One-year Grant
- Cost Reimbursement
- Public Health AmeriCorps does not have a Match or Cost Sharing requirement
- FT = Full time, TQT = Three Quarter Time, HT= Half Time, RHT = Reduced Half Time, QT = Quarter time, MT=Minimum Time, AT = Abbreviated time

AmeriCorps Members

- Individuals enrolled for a specific term of service with an AmeriCorps program
- Members are not volunteers or employees
- Members have a contract with the program
- Members must commit to a specific term of service

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Member Living Allowance



- Not considered a salary or wage
- Not required for members serving less than full-time
- Must comply with maximum limits
- Cost- Reimbursement: must include in proposed budget (Use NOFO section D.6.a)



Prohibited Activities



- (1) Attempting to influence legislation;
- (2) Organizing or engaging in protests, petitions, boycotts, or strikes;
- (3) Assisting, promoting, or deterring union organizing;
- (4) Impairing existing contracts for services or collective bargaining agreements;
- (5) Engaging in partisan political activities, or other activities designed to influence the outcome of an election to any public office;
- (6) Participating in, or endorsing, events or activities that are likely to include advocacy for or against political parties, political platforms, political candidates, proposed legislation, or elected officials;
- (7) Engaging in religious instruction, conducting worship services, providing instruction...

Performance Measures



- If updates made to continuation applications impact performance measures, please make appropriate updates.
- All applications must include at least one aligned performance measure (output and outcome) that corresponds to the proposed primary intervention

FY 24 PHA Grant Cycle Continuation Only Process

Unique continuation process if funding is insufficient to cover all continuation requests.

Not expecting to **fulfilling expansion** requests

Seeking to **make grantees whole up to FY 23 budgets**, taking into account unexpended funding.

Let's walk through an example:

Grantee A requested and received \$50,000 in FY 23 and has \$30,000 in expenditures. Grantee A has \$20,000 in unexpended funding.



Continuation only

<u>SCENARIO 1:</u> AmeriCorps has enough funding to fulfill continuation requests.

Grantee A may receive \$50,000 in new continuation funding

\$20,000 (unexpended) + \$50,000 (new continuation) = \$70,000

For FY24, Grantee A will have \$70,000 in total funding available.

Please note that Grantee A is not required to request the same amount of funding that was requested in FY23. Grantee A's FY24 funding request should align with current capacity and program needs.



Example

Grantee A requested & received \$50,000 in FY23 & has \$30,000 in expenditures. Grantee A has \$20,000 in unexpended funding.

Continuation only

 $\underline{\textbf{SCENARIO 2:}} \ \text{AmeriCorps has insufficient funding to fulfill all continuation requests}$

 $550,\!000$ (FY 23 award) - \$20,000 (unexpended) = \$30,000 (max continuation award)

Grantee A may receive a max award of \$30,000.

\$20,000 (unexpended) + \$30,000 (new continuation) = \$50,000

For FY24, Grantee A will have \$50,000 in total funding available which is equal to their FY 23 budget.



Example

Grantee A requested & received \$50,000 in FY23 & has \$30,000 in expenditures. Grantee A has \$20,000 in unexpended funding.

Continuation only

<u>SCENARIO 3:</u> AmeriCorps has insufficient funding to fulfill all continuation requests at the max award.


Grantee A max award is \$30,000. However, AmeriCorps can only fulfill all continuation requests at 50% of the max award

- $$30,000 \text{ (max award)} \times 50\% = $15,000$
- \$20,000 (unexpended) + \$15,000 (new continuation) = \$35,000


For FY24, Grantee A will have \$35,000 in total funding available.



Example
Grantee A requested & received \$50,00
in FY23 & has \$30,000 in expenditures.
Grantee A has \$20,000 in
unexpended funding.







Submitting your Application in eGrants



- Organizations submit grant applications to AmeriCorps via online eGrants system
- If you are a new user, please establish an account using this link: https://egrants.cns.gov/espan/main/login.jsp
 - Click Continuation/Renewal on your eGrants home page, eGrants will show a list of grants that are eligible for continuation.
 - Select the correct grant your organization wishes to continue. <u>Do not</u> start a new application.
 - Edit your continuation application as directed in the Application instructions. When you have completed your work, click the SUBMIT button.



Application Instructions

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Continuation Application Content



AmeriCorps **expects** that programs will maintain a consistent program design, and **most continuation applicants will not request changes**.

If there are changes, information should be provided in the Continuation Changes narrative field as relevant:

- Changes in **Operating Sites**
- Significant Changes in **Program Scope or Design**
- Changes to **Performance Measures**
- Significant Changes to Monitoring Structures or Staffing
- Budget revisions

The **page limit** for the Continuation Changes field is **six pages** as the pages print out from eGrants.



<u>Application Instructions</u>

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Application Review



Non-competitive review process based on:

- progress reports,
- the federal financial report,
- evaluation plans, and
- AmeriCorps staff's knowledge of the grant program.

To be approved for continuation funding, recipients must:

- demonstrate satisfactory performance with respect to key program goals and requirements,
- compliance with the terms and conditions of the grant.

AmeriCorps reserves the right to award applications in an amount less than the requested level of funding and will document the rationale for doing so. Use Section E of the NOFO for more information.
