

## AmeriCorps NCCC Sponsor Survey Fact Sheet

## About AmeriCorps NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC is a national service program whose mission is to strengthen communities and develop leaders through direct, team-based national and community service. Within a full-time, residential setting, AmeriCorps NCCC members are assigned to a regional campus and placed onto teams of eight to 12 members. Over the course of their 10-month service term, each team will complete a series of different projects in different places, with each project lasting three to 13 weeks. Members work on projects with sponsoring organizations to address local community needs in the areas of energy conservation, environmental stewardship, infrastructure improvement, natural and other disaster services, and urban and rural development.


AmeriCorps collects feedback from sponsoring organizations using the AmeriCorps NCCC Sponsor Survey to learn about their experiences with the program and teams working at sponsor organizations' service projects. A total of 941 sponsors<sup>1</sup> responded to the survey between June
