MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN MISSOURI

More than 7,400 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in Missouri. Serving at more than 880 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$18,850,000 to support Missouri communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$6,270,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

AmeriCorps: This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 1,700 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across Missouri. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Missouri Community Service Commission, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service, AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 12,000 Missouri residents have served more than 17 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$36,370,000.

Senior Corps: More than 5,600 seniors in Missouri contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 3,100 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 650 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 400 groups across Missouri.

Social Innovation Fund: The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in Missouri, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing \$1,510,000 in expanding the impact of 9 nonprofits in Missouri, selected and supported by 1 intermediary.

- This figure represents the maximum potential value of Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards that can be earned by AmeriCorps members serving in Missouri. The award can be used in any state to pay for college, graduate school, vocational training, or to pay back student loans. The education award total is included in total CNCS funding.
- AmeriCorps National figures may include national programs headquartered in the state and/or operating sites of national programs that are headquartered in other states. Funding reflects the estimated proportionate share of the national grant associated with operating sites in this report. Some national organizations do not report operating site data, or it was not available at time of publishing, so figures may not reflect current conditions.
- Missouri is served by the AmeriCorps NCCC campus located in Denver, Colorado. In the past year, AmeriCorps NCCC teams have served on projects in Neosho, Jefferson City, Williamsburg, Saint Robert, Kansas City, Doniphan.

- As part of its public-private partnership approach, CNCS requires grantees to leverage additional resources to strengthen community impact and increase the return on the federal investment. National Service Impact in Missouri

AmeriCorps

AmeriCorps members serving with the Missouri College Advising Corps (MCAC) provide college and financial aid counseling to first-generation-college, low-income, and minority students in schools across Missouri. AmeriCorps has enabled MCAC to expand from seven high schools to 26, with advising now available to 26,000 high school students statewide. Of this total, nearly 10,000 students are served by AmeriCorps members. Advisees increasingly apply to and are admitted to a greater number of postsecondary institutions, with 2011 graduates applying to 385 institutions and being admitted to 218. Advisees are also applying to and are being admitted to increasingly highly selective institutions. Across the program, 4,039 advisees have gone directly from high school to college. The college-going rate in the 10 AmeriCorps-served schools increased by an average of 10.05 percentage points, as compared to a 3-year average baseline, with 850 graduates in 2012 going immediately to college.

AmeriCorps NCCC

The Waynesville R-VI School District in Missouri has a high transient population, widespread poverty, and a rural location. Sixty-six percent of students receive free or reduced lunches. Waynesville schools offered a five-week Adventure Leadership Camp for 213 youth, led by an AmeriCorps NCCC team. Members provided students with an opportunity to experience leadership through practice, hands on adventure activities, and service projects.

AmeriCorps VISTA

College Bound in St. Louis engaged 13 trained AmeriCorps VISTA members to provide students from under-resourced backgrounds with the skills needed to enter and succeed in four-year colleges and careers. College Bound's VISTAs recruited 507 volunteers in 2012. Through their service, VISTAs built capacity in all areas of College Bound programming and operations. VISTA members contributed to the following outcomes: 98.7 percent of participating seniors graduated high school, 92.4 percent of seniors successfully matriculated into a post-secondary institution, 76.8 percent of college students successfully re-enrolled for another year of college, and 92.5 percent of collegians enrolled in college and graduated in 2012.

Senior Corps

Forty RSVP volunteers from Douglass Community Services in Hannibal donated more than 1,000 hours toward hunger relief in the first half of 2012. A recent survey of clients of the Douglass Community Services food distribution services found that the efforts of food pantry services and RSVP volunteers have made a positive impact in the battle to beat hunger. Seventy percent of the respondents indicated that they did not have to skip meals or reduce portions, 65% indicated that they never run out of food because of the assistance, and an overwhelming 98% of survey respondents reported eating healthier because of the food assistance.

Social Innovation Fund

With their average annual Social Innovation Fund Grant of \$1 million and dollar-for-dollar nonfederal matching funds, the Missouri Foundation for Health is investing in seven nonprofit subgrantees to reduce risk factors and the prevalence of two preventable causes of chronic disease and death in Missouri: tobacco use and obesity. The potential short-term impacts of the project on individuals and communities include increase in access to services for community residents, increases in local health policy changes in targeted communities, increases in understanding of health effects and preventive activities, and expansion of Community Health Improvement into subgrantee communities. Longer-term impacts include decreases in smoking rates and exposure to indoor tobacco smoke, increases in physical activity, higher rates of consumption of five fruits and vegetables per day, and decreases in rates of diabetes, asthma, high blood pressure, and reports of fair or poor health status.
