MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN TEXAS

More than 26,000 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in Texas. Serving at more than 3,200 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$50,930,000 to support Texas communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$18,150,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

AmeriCorps: This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 4,500 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across Texas. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the OneStar Foundation, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service. AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 45,000 Texas residents have served more than 59 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$122,950,000.

Senior Corps: More than 21,000 seniors in Texas contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 7,200 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 1,500 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 1,900 groups across Texas.

Social Innovation Fund: The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in Texas, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing \$890,000 in expanding the impact of 8 nonprofits in Texas.

The Corporation for National and Community Service is a federal agency that improves lives, strengthens communities, and fosters civic engagement through service and volunteering. CNCS annually engages more than five million Americans in service to meet local needs through Senior Corps, AmeriCorps, and national days of service; improves communities through the Social Innovation Fund, and leads President Obama's national call to service initiative, United We Serve. As part of its public-private partnership approach, CNCS requires grantees to leverage additional resources to strengthen community impact and increase the return on the federal investment. This figure reflects non-CNCS cash and in-kind resources that CNCS grantees and project sponsors have committed to raise to support their programming activities across the state.

National Service Impact in Texas



AmeriCorps

American YouthWorks' Texas Conservation Corps (TxCC) is a jobs training and national service program that allows young adults to serve their community while learning valuable skills in the field. In 2013-14, TxCC's 20-AmeriCorps member Emergency Response Team, funded by OneStar Foundation, played a critical role in six major disaster deployments across Texas and the nation, including Hurricane Sandy (NY/NJ), West Fertilizer Plant Explosion (TX), Oklahoma Tornadoes (OK), Eagle Pass Flooding (TX), Alaska's Yukon River Flooding (AK), and Central Texas Halloween Floods (TX). By combining emergency response with natural resource conservation, TxCC Emergency Response Team AmeriCorps members are able to address the environmental and community problems and implement real time solutions. Members serve 11 months and receive training in Incident Command, Wilderness First Aid, Volunteer and Donations Management, and Leave No Trace among other conservation and disaster functions. As a response resource for the state of Texas, they are available within 24 hours and each team can deploy for up to two months at a time.

AmeriCorps NCCC

The Center for Maximum Potential Building Systems (CMPBS), established in 1975, is a nonprofit education, research, and demonstration organization specializing in life cycle planning and design. CMPBS undertakes projects based on their potential contribution to sustainability and human health. CMPBS received funding to construct a prototype small sustainable village. AmeriCorps NCCC members learned how to plan and build all the components of a sustainable village. They built three houses and then tested this sustainable village prototype. They helped assess its performance in disaster areas. The team's experience was recorded and will be used as a training tool for future groups.

AmeriCorps VISTA

Cornerstone Assistance Network is an intermediary agency which supports 16 partner organizations with AmeriCorps VISTA sites throughout Texas. The VISTA team raised more than \$180,000 in grants and secured four property donations valued at \$195,000 which has assisted GED scholarship programs, area revitalizations, and job training internship programs for 50 interns. Tarrant Literacy Coalition, a partner site, launched a program that trained 80 people and gave away more than \$8,000 worth of materials for a summer learning conference in ESL and citizenship class instruction. The Charitable Clinic initiated its first Community Awareness Program and increased inquiries from the professional community and raised \$7,000 in revenue enabling low-income community members to get free and suitable health care.

Senior Corps

The Michael E. DeBakey VA Medical Center in Houston served 131,988 veterans in 2012, with 50,191 being 65 years or older. In recent years, there has been an increase in admission of younger veterans from the Gulf Wars leaving fewer volunteers to support the older veterans. In response, Harris County Senior Companion volunteers, sponsored by the Evelyn Rubenstein Jewish Community Center of Houston, serve older veterans in hospice care, veterans in home base care, and veterans living in the aging ward. In 2012, 54 veterans received daily visits and support services from Senior Companion volunteers. Ninety percent of the veterans served reported that they felt less isolated due to the regular interactions with Senior Companion volunteers and 80 percent documented a reduction in the side effects of depression as a result of the daily visits from their Senior Companion volunteers.

Social Innovation Fund

The Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC), an intermediary grantee of the Social Innovation Fund, is growing Financial Opportunity Centers — a workforce development and asset-building model that boosts earnings, reduces expenses and coaches low-income families on how to make better financial decisions — to reach 7,500 total participants. In Texas, LISC has three nonprofit subgrantees receiving total annual grants of \$569,000 which they match dollar-for-dollar. A rigorous evaluation will provide greater evidence about the model's impact on employment, earnings and savings.

Volunteer Generation Fund

OneStar Foundation, the Texas State Service Commission, continued its work on the Texas Volunteer Generation Project, which focuses on building the capacity of volunteer connector organizations to enhance volunteer impact and tackle critical social issues. In 2013-14, OneStar partnered with the Texas Association of Volunteer Centers to host seven regional symposiums across the state facilitated by national and regional experts on volunteer engagement as well as a 12-hour virtual service jam. During the service jam, 10 experts on volunteerism led conversations on "Growing Through Serving," "Best Practices in Short Term Volunteer Engagement," "Innovations in Short Term Service," "The Impact of Service" and more. Two hundred registrants across the country participated in the event.
