MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN COLORADO

More than 10,000 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in Colorado. Serving at more than 770 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$31,940,000 to support Colorado communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$12,970,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

AmeriCorps: This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 2,200 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across Colorado. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Serve Colorado, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service. AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 30,000 Colorado residents have served more than 27 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$65,340,000.

Senior Corps: More than 7,800 seniors in Colorado contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 2,700 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 960 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 280 groups across Colorado.

Social Innovation Fund: The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in Colorado, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing more than \$1,680,000 in expanding the impact of 8 nonprofits in Colorado, selected and supported by 1 intermediary.

The Corporation for National and Community Service is a federal agency that improves lives, strengthens communities, and fosters civic engagement through service and volunteering. CNCS annually engages more than five million Americans in service to meet local needs through Senior Corps, AmeriCorps, and national days of service; improves communities through the Social Innovation Fund, and leads President Obama's national call to service initiative, United We Serve. AmeriCorps State

Only 65.5 percent of students are graduating from high school in metropolitan Denver. Students who are not reading at proficient levels in the early grades typically do not catch up as they transition from learning to read to reading to learn. These students find schoolwork more challenging which can lead to course failure and disengagement from school. Forty-eight Colorado Reading Corps AmeriCorps tutors are located in 26 Metro Denver Schools. Tutors see between 15-18 students every day and continue to work with these students until they successfully graduate the program. These 48 AmeriCorps tutors served 1,284 students in Aurora, Adams 12, Denver Public Schools, and Jefferson County. More than 78 percent of exited students met or exceeded Spring Benchmark. Kindergarten, first and third graders all exceeded the target growth per week indicator by more than 86 percent. One hundred percent of AmeriCorps tutors, teachers and school administrators felt that participating in Reading Corps had a positive impact on students

AmeriCorps VISTA

SOS Outreach is a youth development nonprofit that builds character and self-esteem in underserved youth through outdoor adventure and leadership development programs. AmeriCorps VISTA members support the Friends of SOS Outreach Pledge Campaign, which encourages program volunteers, mentors, and staff to raise funds. Though the campaign, 196 new donors contributed more than \$25,000. VISTA members took a significant lead throughout the campaign. They developed marketing materials and a marketing plan, and conducted outreach. The annual Friends of SOS Outreach Pledge Campaign is now sustainable and will continue to provide lasting support for SOS Outreach program growth.

AmeriCorps VISTA members served tirelessly with the Colorado Nonprofit Development Center (CNDC) in 2014 to increase funding at their project sites. They helped raise more than \$2.9 million for project sites. VISTA member Caitlin Glasgo—who served at Project VOYCE, a youth development organization—raised more than \$35,000 to benefit the project's Summer Leadership Institute. With the help of VISTA member Benjamin Wind, Colorado Construction Institute, received a \$1.1 million YouthBuild USA grant from the U.S. Department of Labor. A YouthBuild site, Colorado Construction Institute will use the funds to continue training low-income youth in residential construction techniques while they study to earn their GEDs or high school diplomas.

AmeriCorps NCCC

In September 2013 Lyons, Colorado was severely affected by flooding. A dam four miles northwest in Pinewood Springs overtopped, blocking all access routes in and out of the town of Lyons as well as disrupting sewer and water services. An AmeriCorps NCCC team was tasked with a number of natural disaster and flood relief related jobs throughout their project term to help Lyons, CO recover. During the first three weeks, Corps members worked on 12 homes that were affected by the flood and prepared them for mold remediation. In addition to this, Corps members installed a 550 ft. fence around the sewage treatment plant and helped deliver new appliances to various residents in the area. The following three weeks, the team finished up work in Lyon and completed similar projects in Big Elk and Jamestown. During the final week the team was sent back to Lyons, CO to work on 4 different homes and helped move supplies. With the work done, almost all of the high priority houses were either finished or sprayed to treat the mold in the house. With the help of Corps members, the first person whose home was destroyed or affected by the flood was able to move back into their home.

An AmeriCorps NCCC team was requested by The Mountain Valley School (MVS) to help tutor and mentor 134 students (pre-K – 12th) and support school administrative functions. School test scores at MVS are below expected state levels and many students come from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, with nearly 70% of students qualifying for free or reduced-price lunches. The team assisted in almost all aspects of the school's daily logistics and long term goals. Corps members worked in the school cafeteria preparing and serving 1072 meals as well as aiding in clean-up. Others worked 950 hours tutoring in classrooms reaching out to 24% of the student body. Some wrote grants to secure funding for a school that has a small operating budget. Custodial work was a frequent chore as the school cannot afford to pay anyone full-time. The team coordinated and ran an entire after school program that included seven clubs from writing and drama to basketball and yoga. In addition to corps members planning and running classes and activities, team members also shuttled students home as the Saguache community is one that is heavily dependent on government aid and gas money is an expenditure few can afford.

Senior Corps Foster Grandparent Program

Foster Grandparents with the Senior Resource Development Agency in Pueblo serve preschool/Head Start children who have special or exceptional needs. Foster Grandparents engage the preschoolers one on one in language, pre-reading skills, letter identification, number identification, colors, following directions, and various social skills. Foster Grandparents also encourage children to develop social and age appropriate interactions with peers. U.S. Census Bureau data from 2010 indicate that Pueblo leads the state of Colorado in child poverty at the rate of 36 percent. These children are in danger of falling behind in their social emotional, physical, and cognitive development and at risk for advancing to their next age appropriate level. In 2013, 27 Foster Grandparents served 94 children and 100 percent of the students were promoted to the next grade level.



Senior Corps RSVP

The Volunteers of America Larimer County RSVP project mobilized 180 RSVP volunteers in response and recovery efforts after the 2013 Colorado floods devastated Northern Colorado. Volunteers served more than 2,657 hours cleaning up debris, serving as case managers, and supporting operations at the Disaster Donation Center. Additionally, 15 crew leaders managed more than 1,500 community volunteers. During the flood recovery process over the past year, RSVP volunteers have served more than 172 clients through the case management office and on debris removal projects. According to exit surveys, half of these clients have had 100 percent of their unmet needs met by services provided by RSVP volunteers and their cases have been closed. All of the clients have had at least one unmet need met and volunteers are working to assist with their remaining needs.

Senior Corps Senior Companion Program

In Mesa County there are about 10,000 residents who are 75 and older; approximately 7,500 still live independently. Non-driving elders who cannot utilize Grand Valley Transit or disability transportation must rely on family members or friends, who often cannot meet all their needs. St. Mary's Senior Companion Program in Grand Junction utilizes Senior Companions to visit and assist elderly clients once a week throughout the year to help with shopping, medical appointments and outings. While addressing their needs for transportation and community access, the Senior Companions provide valuable socialization and friendship. In 2014, 48 Senior Companions provided service to 294 elders. One hundred percent of the senior clients reported that their ability to live independently was maintained or improved.

Social Innovation Fund

The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in Colorado, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing \$1,886,170 in expanding the impact of eight nonprofits in Colorado, selected and supported by two intermediaries. Mile High United Way is working to increase the percentage of children reading by 3rd grade and the U.S. Soccer Foundation is leading children and youth to decrease BMI and increase nutritional knowledge and choices through its Soccer for Success Program.
