MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN ILLINOIS

More than 15,000 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in Illinois. Serving at more than 2,000 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$38,680,000 to support Illinois communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$15,640,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

AmeriCorps: This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 2,800 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across Illinois. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Serve Illinois, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service. AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 35,000 Illinois residents have served more than 48 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$111,370,000.

Senior Corps: More than 12,000 seniors in Illinois contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 4,000 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 800 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 950 groups across Illinois.

Social Innovation Fund: The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in Illinois, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing more than \$960,000 in expanding the impact of 12 nonprofits in Illinois.

The Corporation for National and Community Service is a federal agency that improves lives, strengthens communities, and fosters civic engagement through service and volunteering. National Service Impact in Illinois



AmeriCorps State

After tornadoes struck Tazewell County in November of 2013, the Fostering Transitions AmeriCorps program oversaw donations management. They stood up and staffed the distribution center five to six days a week. The AmeriCorps members recruited 226 volunteers to assist with the project. The distribution center provided groceries, pet supplies, construction materials, cleaning supplies, baby necessities, and clothing for the victims. In total, the program managed \$1,000,000 in donated goods and the volunteers provided 6,109 hours of service for \$147,110 in impact. This work led to the creation of the statewide Illinois Disaster Corps, a response team trained to support communities in times of disaster. Taking the lessons learned from Harrisburg, Washington, and the flooding in Chicago, this corps of AmeriCorps members and other volunteers support communities by serving as a local resource with the knowledge to support volunteer or donations management. They will also serve on long-term recovery committees. While not responding to disasters, the Corps members will work with local volunteer connecting agencies to build up their community's resiliency.

AmeriCorps National

Citizen Schools is a nonprofit organization that partners with middle schools to expand the learning day for children in low-income communities. Citizen Schools mobilizes a team of AmeriCorps educators and volunteers to lead real-world learning projects and provide academic support, helping all students discover and achieve their dreams. In their two years of service, AmeriCorps members serve as "Teaching Fellows," providing students with months of extra learning through academic mentoring and skill-building apprenticeships that translates into college readiness and career opportunities. Citizen Schools has been recognized as a leader in engaging volunteers, generating student impact, and balancing direct service with systemic change efforts. A longitudinal study found that former Citizen Schools participants graduated from high school within four years at a rate of 71 percent, compared to 59 percent among matched peers, and internal analyses have found that 61 percent of Citizen Schools' alumni enroll in college.

Chicago's HIV prevalence rate is nearly three times that of the national average. To address HIV in their community, a team of nine full time AIDS United AmeriCorps members provide direct services to Chicago residents, including HIV testing and counseling, health care access, prevention outreach, prevention education, and emotional and social services to at-risk populations. Since 2000, AIDS United AmeriCorps members in Chicago have informed over 20,000 individuals of their HIV status through HIV rapid testing and counseled them on their risk behaviors. Additionally, the team has reached over 35,000 individuals through community outreach and education, providing information about HIV/AIDS risk reduction and connecting people to medical care. AmeriCorps members have also mobilized over 1,000 volunteers in the Chicago area.

AmeriCorps VISTA

The Top Box Foods AmeriCorps VISTA project addresses the issue of "food deserts" and "food swamps" in low-income Chicago neighborhoods that either lack grocery stores or have an abundance of fast food. Top Box provides high quality and nutritious food at affordable prices to low-income individuals and families. AmeriCorps VISTA members help expand the program by adding churches, community organizations, schools, pantries, public housing, and senior centers as partners. This year VISTAs developed 21 new community partners, recruited 75 more community volunteers, and secured \$48,000 in grant funding. These operational and financial capacity-building efforts enabled the program to distribute 227,284 lbs. of food, including 137,445 lbs. of fresh produce to 1,450 new customers. Most program participants (90 percent report that Top Box increases their food security and helps them to provide high quality nutritional meals to their family.

AmeriCorps NCCC

An AmeriCorps NCCC team partnered with the Coppin Community Center (CCC) to support the Washington Park neighborhood in a multitude of social service's needs. The CCC provides community development and supportive services to address the social and academic needs of low income and vulnerable children and families in the Washington Park neighborhood and beyond. Every Monday, the NCCC team worked at CCC's food pantry. Over the course of the project, Corps members unloaded, unpacked, and sorted 23,500 pounds of food and distributed this food to approximately 536 people. After distributing food, members cleaned up the tables, floors, and discarded food boxes. The team assisted in the maintenance of the Metro Garden that CCC partners with and creation of CCC's community garden. The team built seven 4' x 4' beds to be used for a vegetable, butterfly, and herb garden. In addition to this work, the NCCC team planned and executed a Book Distribution event for children who had attended Coppin's Freedom School last summer and a Community Family Day event, which focused on engaging pantry clients to help them see Coppin as a space for family. Lastly, members assisted with the maintenance of the CCC.

AmeriCorps NCCC Cont'd

Historic Methodist Campground's (HMC) requested an AmeriCorps NCCC team to help restore the Campground from flooding damage that occurred in 2008 and 2013. The goal of the HMC is to inspire visitors to experience life on an 1860 campsite. NCCC Corps members landscaped three acres of land. The team scraped, primed, and painted a hotel porch, three outdoor bath houses, five medium sized cottages, and an industrial antique cooler. Members also painted a hallway, three dining hall pantries, ten baseboards, an office, a community house, two lifeguard chairs, one dining hall, and one tool shed. Some members completed demolition on three cottage porches. Deep cleaning occurred in three large buildings which included the Dining Hall's industrial kitchen. New stairs were built on the campground's community house and a new roof was built on a garden shed. The public's ability to use the Campground was enhanced both safety-wise and aesthetically due to the NCCC team's work. The removal of the porches also restored the buildings to their original footprint. The renovations also made the campground more aesthetically pleasing to campground residents and potential visitors.

Senior Corps Foster Grandparent Program

Sixty Foster Grandparents serve through the Tri-County Opportunities Council in Rock Falls. The program developed a year-end child impact assessment, collected from 110 teachers in 19 schools during the 2013/2014 school year. Teachers reported 215 of the 238 at risk students improved their age appropriate reading abilities. Thirty-five of those students improved their reading abilities by 100 percent and 95 students made significant improvements (80 percent). Teachers also reported that 87 (36 percent) students demonstrated a 100 percent improvement in their self-confidence and 65 students' self-confidence increased by 80 percent.

Senior Corps RSVP

RSVP of Clay, Effingham, Moultrie, and Shelby Counties, sponsored by CEFS Economic Opportunity Corporation, has 85,044 individuals aged 65 and many of those are living alone. Many of these individuals are disabled or have health issues that prevent them from driving or preparing meals on their own. RSVP partnered with 12 area organizations to provide meals and companion services to more than 600 atrisk seniors. Five days each week, 215 RSVP volunteers delivered meals and visited with 613 frail, elderly clients. The result of this intervention is 55 percent or 337 seniors reported that they had increase social support due to the service of RSVP volunteers and 100 percent of the seniors said the extra meals were necessary for them to stay independent.

Senior Corps Senior Companion Program

Rich Township sponsors the Senior Companion Program of Suburban Cook County. Sixty-five Senior Companions provided 67,860 hours of service last year to 165 frail, elderly homebound seniors. These Senior Companions provide services such as transportation, socialization, and companionship. The clients can be transported to local stores, medical appointments, and the library. Of the 481,000 senior citizens in Suburban Cook County more than 233,000 are living alone with disabilities including hearing, vision cognitive, and self-care disabilities. Senior Companions directly impact this vulnerable population. Ninety-one percent of clients reported feeling less lonely and isolated since receiving visits from their Senior Companion.

Each session is built around a lesson designed to develop a specific skill through stories, role-playing, and group exercises, and includes a homework assignment to practice and apply that skill. The afterschool sports component reinforces conflict resolution skills and the social and emotional learning objectives of the BAM curriculum. The BAM program is an evidenced-based intervention and recently underwent a randomized controlled trial conducted by the University of Chicago Crime Lab that showed it increased school engagement, reduced arrests for both violent and nonviolent crime, and had the potential to increase high school graduation rates. With this investment, Youth Guidance will be able to serve an additional 2,420 young men through the BAM program in existing and new sites throughout Chicago.
