



## National Service in Oregon



### MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN OREGON

More than 6,200 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in Oregon. Serving at more than 810 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$14,800,000 to support Oregon communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$6,600,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

**AmeriCorps:** This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 970 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across Oregon. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Oregon Volunteers, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service, AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 16,000 Oregon residents have served more than 21 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$49,170,000.

**Senior Corps:** More than 5,200 seniors in Oregon contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 1,700 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 990 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 280 groups across Oregon.

The Corporation for National and Community Service is a federal agency that improves lives, strengthens communities, and fosters civic engagement through service and volunteering. CNCS annually engages more than five million Americans in service to meet local needs through Senior Corps, AmeriCorps, and national days of service; improves communities through the Social Innovation Fund, and leads President Obama's national call to service initiative, United We Serve. ## AmeriCorps State

The Oregon State Service Corps (OSSC) is an AmeriCorps program sponsored by the American Red Cross that places 63 AmeriCorps members statewide to support organizations in meeting critical community needs. OSSC's primary focus areas are ensuring that individuals, businesses, and communities are prepared for disasters and building the capacity of community organizations to respond. In the 2013-14 program year, AmeriCorps members provided disaster preparedness training to nearly 25,000 individuals, led 28 organizations in completing a disaster action plan, and engaged 47 organizations in a statewide earthquake drill. AmeriCorps members also recruited more than 6,500 volunteers who provided more than 50,000 hours of service to community organizations. Other accomplishments include providing 1,389 Oregonians with training and services to promote their economic opportunity; promoting healthy living practices for 9,335 youth and adults; enriching the educational experiences of 20,174 children and youth; and supporting the success of 259 veterans and military families.

Metropolitan Family Service's Building Engagement in Schools Together (BEST) AmeriCorps program supports community schools to be full-service neighborhood hubs where the school and partners from across the community come together to make sure kids and families have what they need to be successful in school and in life. Twenty-one BEST AmeriCorps members serve at schools in East Multnomah and North Clackamas county to build students' leadership skills through service-learning projects focused on health and wellness and to connect families and the community at large to their school. In the 2013-14 program year, BEST AmeriCorps members guided 728 students in more than 10,000 hours of service-learning projects including school and community clean-ups, and running a food pantry and clothing closet at the school for families and community members. BEST AmeriCorps members also engaged more than 1,600 volunteers in community schools including 334 families. In addition, BEST AmeriCorps members led 90 community events focused on health and wellness and provided 30 financial literacy workshops for economically disadvantaged families and community members.

## AmeriCorps National

College Possible Portland, serving 1,100 students, is closing Oregon's degree divide and building a competitive workforce for the future. By 2020, 70 percent of jobs in Oregon will require a post-secondary education, but only 8 percent of low-income students nationally earn a college degree by age 24. College Possible Portland's AmeriCorps coaches guide low-income students through all aspects of preparing for, applying to, and enrolling in college, and support students all the way through college graduation. Ninety-eight percent of College Possible students earn admission to college, and they are ten times more likely to graduate from college than their low-income peers. A 2013 Harvard randomized controlled trial confirmed the impact of College Possible's AmeriCorps-based program model, finding that students in the program had a significant positive increase in four-year college enrollment. By harnessing the power of national service, College Possible creates better futures for all Oregonians.

## AmeriCorps VISTA

Oregon Health Authority sponsors a team of 29 AmeriCorps VISTA members serving throughout Oregon with local community health agencies. The project works to reduce poverty in local communities by building sustainable county and statewide healthy community initiatives that ensure resiliency and improved health outcomes for all. This past year the VISTA team leveraged \$2,294,189 through cash and in-kind resources, developed 158 new partnerships, and managed 5,943 volunteers. Through programs and services developed by the VISTA team, 2,842 new community members received health services. One example of their success is member Ramon Martinez who worked with a team to write a Health System Transformation grant application that was funded at \$1,600,000 for the Inter-Community Health Network Coordinated Care Organization. The grant is being used to improve system efficiency and data sharing in the region including Benton, Linn, and Lincoln Counties. This will ultimately improve access to health care services for low-income residents, including many Medicare and Medicaid patients in the area.

Mercy Corps Northwest sponsors a statewide team of 15 AmeriCorps VISTA members dedicated to increasing financial assets, improving job skills leading to employment opportunities, and increasing food security in low-income communities. VISTA members serve with various community based organizations across the state of Oregon. Over the last year, the project conducted 63 micro-lending outreach events, supported the strategic distribution of \$450,000 in micro-lending capital to startup businesses, and trained 2,063 people in small business management and development. Additionally, the program has been able to place 42 families in housing and provided housing-related education to 280 individuals. The program also designed and delivered an entrepreneurship class in Russian for the first time ever, providing access to education and business services among low income Russian speaking community members. Over the last year, members have raised more than \$140,000 in cash resources to support local, community based projects.

## AmeriCorps NCCC

Josephine County Food Bank, is a program of the United Community Action Network, is a regional food bank serving all of Josephine County, Oregon through our network of nine pantries, five community kitchens, and eleven supplemental agencies. An AmeriCorps NCCC team served with Josephine County food bank where the team planted and harvested food and helped maintain the twenty acre property. The team began by planting crops for the food bank's customers. After the planting was completed, corps members watered and weeded plants daily. While maintaining the plants, the team also repaired the irrigation system. The team harvested 3,065 pounds of cucumbers, zucchinis, eggplant, and peppers from the garden. Corps members also repaired damaged fences and built 210 feet of new fences. In addition, team members mulched a garden and built an owl box to attract owls to the farm and protect crops. The team hauled away 3,750 pounds of debris, consisting of weeds, garbage, old irrigation lines, and building materials that had been dumped on the property. Josephine County Food Bank first became an AmeriCorps NCCC sponsor in 2012.

The mission of Woape is to provide community and occupation based teaching using indoor and outdoor classrooms of experiences supporting spiritual, emotional, mental, and physical development and well-being. In 2008, the organization was expanded to meet local youth needs through the creation of AntFarm. AntFarm consists of a number of programs: tutoring, a social enterprise café, arts, farmer's market and garden, elderly support services, and work skills development. An AmeriCorps NCCC team served with Woape during the summer of 2014, during which they supported AntFarms in three different areas through their gardening facility, expanding a recycling program, and teaching youth. The team expansion of the AntFarm recycling program contributed a total of 24,384 cans and bottles with redemption value codes. Through AntFarm's community outreach service project, Community Connect, the team served on landscaping and home improvement projects. They removed 210 pounds of unwanted vegetation and landscaped a total of sixteen homes in the Sandy, Oregon area. The team monitored the youth who attend AntFarm's out of school program and coordinated several volunteers in the community garden.

## Senior Corps Foster Grandparent Program

Multnomah County Aging and Disability Services sponsors Oregon's tri-county, metropolitan Foster Grandparent Program serving Clackamas, Washington, and Multnomah Counties. The program taps the skills, talents, and experience of adults age 55 and older to make significant impacts in the academic, social and emotional lives of children in the community. During the last program year, 77 Foster Grandparents contributed 57,341 hours of one-on-one tutoring and mentoring services to 764 high need children throughout the area. Outcomes of participating youth include improved academic performance and improved school attendance. Additionally, youth participating in early education activities with Foster Grandparent demonstrated gains in social and/or emotional development, helping them to be better prepared to enter kindergarten.

## Senior Corps RSVP

The Jackson County Community Volunteer Network RSVP program engages 830 volunteers in high impact volunteer service to the community. Through its Dial-A-Ride program, RSVP volunteers provide free medical transportation to low-income clients without access to transportation. This much-needed program is customer service oriented, as volunteers use their own vehicles and act as door-to-door escorts for the clients. Last year, 29 volunteers provided medical transportation to 276 clients. Larry is an outstanding volunteer that has served with the program for more than seven years. Larry volunteers for this important duty regardless of the time of day. It makes no difference to Larry if the client needs a 5:00 am medical transport. Larry averages 3,990 miles a year transporting clients that have become a very special part of his life.

## Senior Corps Senior Companion Program

Lane County Community College sponsors the Lane County Senior Companion Program. During the last program year, 76 volunteers provided 53,197 hours of independent living services to 198 clients. The impact of one volunteer was particularly astounding. Senior Companion Volunteer, Martha Jason, went to her client's home one morning for her regular visit. When the client didn't respond, Martha tried to reach her station supervisor. The supervisor was not available so Martha called 911. Officers arrived on the scene and found the client alive, though she had been stuck in the bathtub since Saturday. The Senior Companion Martha accompanied her client to the hospital, joined by the site supervisor. They learned the client was dehydrated and very sore, but that she would be okay. Upon the supervisor's approval, Martha made additional visits to the client in the subsequent weeks to help her get back into her routine and plan for how to avoid this type of accident in the future. The client, her family, Senior and Disability Services, and the Senior Companion office lauded Martha's tenacity, good judgment and compassion.
