Year in Review



MEETING NEEDS IN COLORADO

Last year more than 6,900 Americans of all ages and backgrounds met local needs, strengthened communities, and expanded economic opportunity through national service in Colorado. The Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) invested more than \$26.2 million in federal funding to support cost-effective community solutions, working hand in hand with local partners to empower citizens to solve problems. AmeriCorps members and Senior Corps volunteers are preparing today's students for tomorrow's jobs, reducing crime and reviving cities, connecting veterans to services, fighting the opioid epidemic, helping seniors live independently, and rebuilding communities after disasters.

National service participants served at more than 800 locations across Colorado, including schools, food banks, homeless shelters, health clinics, youth centers, veterans' facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations. Through a unique public-private partnership, CNCS, its grantees, and project sponsors generated more than \$9.5 million in outside resources from businesses, foundations, public agencies, and other sources in Colorado in the last year. This local support strengthened community impact and increased the return on taxpayer dollars.

AMERICORPS



Last year, more than 2,100 AmeriCorps members met pressing local needs across Colorado, making a lasting impact in communities while gaining valuable skills and experience to advance their careers. AmeriCorps members serve in one of three programs:

- AmeriCorps State & National engages men and women
 in intensive service at thousands of locations across the
 country through nonprofits, schools, public agencies,
 tribes, and community and faith-based groups. Most
 AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Serve Colorado
 Governor's Commission on Community Service, the
 Governor-appointed State Service Commission, which in
 turn awards grants to organizations to respond to local
 needs.
- AmeriCorps VISTA (Volunteers In Service To America)
 taps the skills, talents, and passion of Americans of all
 ages to support community efforts to overcome poverty.
- AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps)
 is a full-time, team-based residential program for 18-24
 year-olds. Members develop leadership skills by
 contributing to public safety, environment, and disaster
 projects. FEMA Corps, a unit of NCCC, focuses solely on
 disaster preparedness, response, and recovery.

In exchange for their service, AmeriCorps members earn a Segal AmeriCorps Education Award that can be used to pay for trade school, college, or graduate school; or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 36,000 Colorado residents have served approximately 36 million hours and earned education awards totaling more than \$90.8 million.

SENIOR CORPS



Senior Corps taps the skills, talents, and experience of Americans age 55 and over to meet a wide range of community challenges. Last year, more than 4,700 Colorado seniors met critical community needs while contributing to their own health and well-being through one of three Senior Corps programs:

- Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to young people with exceptional needs.
- Senior Companions help seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes.
- RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services.

Last year, Foster Grandparents tutored and mentored 2,640 young people, Senior Companions helped 450 seniors live independently, and RSVP volunteers strengthened the impact of 340 organizations across Colorado.

National service programs continue to improve lives and communities in Colorado, with 753 AmeriCorps member and 3,113 Senior Corps volunteers currently serving.

Since 1994, more than 36,000 Colorado residents have served approximately 36 million hours through AmeriCorps, earning Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$90.8 million.

Notes: With the exception of the Current Participants column, all data shown represents national service activity completed between January 7, 2019 and January 6, 2020.

- 1. Projects may be headquartered in other states.
- The service location total may contain multiple counts of unique locations where multiple CNCS programs operated.
- Completed participants reflects all AmeriCorps members who completed service in Colorado between January 7, 2019 and January 6, 2020. For Senior Corps, this reflects all volunteers funded by grants completed during that same period.
- 4. The Education Scholarships figures represent the maximum potential value of Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards that could be earned by AmeriCorps members who completed service in Colorado. The award can be used in any state to pay for college, graduate school, vocational training, or to pay back student loans.
- 5. AmeriCorps State and National, Foster Grandparent, and Senior Companion federal funding reflects the estimated proportionate share of the federal grant associated with the participants in this report. For AmeriCorps VISTA, funding reflects the national average cost per participant. RSVP funding appears in the state where the project is based and reflects the full amount awarded to operate the completed grant.
- 6. Current participants reflects national service participants currently serving in Colorado.
- 7. Total local project support reflects non-CNCS cash and in-kind resources that CNCS grantees committed to raise in support of their completed grants. As part of its public-private partnership approach, CNCS grantees leverage additional resources to strengthen community impact and increase the return on the federal investment.
- 8. Funding for the Social Innovation Fund was eliminated in FY 2017; projects shown operated under previously awarded grants.
- 9. Colorado is home to the Southwest Region campus of AmeriCorps NCCC, located in Denver. Members based at this campus perform service projects throughout Colorado and AR, AZ, KS, MO, NM, OK, TX, and WY.
